RESOLUTION OF THE HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 20(5) OF THE CONSTITUTION OF ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA EXTENDING THE STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY STATUTORY INSTRUMENT 2021

2021, NO. 19

WHEREAS there continues to be in force a State of Public Emergency within the State of Antigua and Barbuda aimed at the protection of the citizens of Antigua and Barbuda and of visitors from the spread of the novel Coronavirus Disease (**COVID-19**) which State of Public Emergency in accordance with the Resolution last made in this Parliament was extended to the 31st March 2021;

AND WHEREAS Section 20 subsection (5) of the Constitution of Antigua and Barbuda provides that –

“A resolution of a House of Parliament passed for the purposes of this section shall remain in force for three months or such shorter period as may be specified therein:

Provided that any such resolution may be extended from time to time by a further such resolution each extension not exceeding three months from the date of the resolution effecting the extension and any such resolution may be revoked at any time by a resolution of that House.”

AND WHEREAS the Government of Antigua and Barbuda is satisfied that the continued effectiveness of the various protocols and measures to control the spread of the dangerous infectious disease **COVID-19** requires that the State of Public Emergency be continued for a further period of three months or until the 28th day of June, 2021 unless sooner revoked by a Resolution of the Parliament.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT this Parliament in accordance with Section 20 subsection (5) of the Constitution of Antigua and Barbuda **HEREBY EXTENDS** the State of Public Emergency for a further ninety (90) days or until the **28th day of June, 2021**

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (DANGEROUS INFECTIOUS DISEASE) (AMENDMENT) (No.6) REGULATIONS 2021, made by the Board pursuant to Section 102 of the Public Health Act, Cap. 353.

1. Citation and commencement

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Amendment) (No. 6) Regulations, 2021.

(2) These Regulations shall take effect from 5:00am on Wednesday 31st March, 2021.

2. Interpretation

In these Regulations –

“principal Regulations” means the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) Regulations 2020, Statutory Instrument No. 16 of 2020

3. Amendment of Regulation 5A of principal Regulations

Regulation 5A of the principal Regulations is amended as follows:

(a) in paragraph 1 (Duration) by repealing the paragraph in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

“Duration

These special measures shall take effect from 5:00am on Wednesday 31st March, 2021 to 5:00am on Monday 28th June, 2021.”

(b) in paragraph 4B (Operation of restaurant businesses) by repealing the paragraph in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

“4B. Operation of restaurant businesses

The owner or operator of a restaurant business that has been certified and approved as COVID compliant is permitted to offer “in-house” dining services, in addition to pick-up or take-out services.”
