ACB Caribbean Hosts Its First Online Annual General Meeting

The 65th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING of the Shareholders of ANTIGUA COMMERCIAL BANK LTD., now trading as ACB CARIBBEAN, was held virtually on Thursday March 25, 2021 in accordance with Article 12.1 of the Company's Bylaws and under the Theme, BUILDING A FUTURE FOR YOU.

Over 100 of our Shareholders, who pre-registered to attend the Meeting online, actively engaged in discussions on key developments in our business and on industry trends within the last year.

Marked by unprecedented events, Financial Year 2020, though presenting significant challenges, also provided opportunities for ACB CARIBBEAN to demonstrate our resilience by enhancing technologies to meet the demands of the "new normal".

For the financial year ended September 30, 2020, the Company recorded a Consolidated Net Profit of \$3.4 million, a decline of 84% from the previous year. This performance was directly impacted by factors arising from the COVID-19 pandemic, provisions that had to be made for some Business and Mortgage loan customers who had been adversely impacted during the year and a change in loan loss provisions which resulted in this category increasing by 108%.

The Company's balance sheet remains strong with Assets growing by approximately \$17 million for a total of \$1.3 billion, reflecting continued strong liquidity and capitalization.

ACB MORTGAGE & TRUST COMPANY LIMITED, the Company's wholly owned Subsidiary, recorded a Net Profit of \$7.2 million and remains a significant presence in the residential housing market, providing competitive terms and excellent customer service.

Shareholders approved a CASH DIVIDEND of \$850,000 for the financial year ended September 30, 2020, to be paid to Shareholders on record as at March 1, 2021.

1. **Basis of preparation**

These summary consolidated financial statements are derived from the audited consolidated financial statements of Antigua Commercial Bank Ltd. and its subsidiaries for the year ended September 30, 2020 and have been prepared in accordance with criteria developed by management.





Bureau of Standards Notice
