RESOLUTION OF THE HOUSES OF PARLIAMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 20(5) OF THE CONSTITUTION

OF ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA EXTENDING THE STATE OF PUBLIC EMERGENCY

STATUTORY INSTRUMENT 2021

2021, NO. 53

WHEREAS there continues to be in force a State of Public Emergency within the State of Antigua and Barbuda aimed at the protection of the citizens of Antigua and Barbuda and of visitors from the spread of the novel Coronavirus Disease (**COVID-19**) which State of Public Emergency in accordance with the Resolution last made in this Parliament was extended to the 28th June, 2021;

AND WHEREAS Section 20 subsection (5) of the Constitution of Antigua and Barbuda provides that –

“A resolution of a House of Parliament passed for the purposes of this section shall remain in force for three months or such shorter period as may be specified therein:

Provided that any such resolution may be extended from time to time by a further such resolution each extension not exceeding three months from the date of the resolution effecting the extension and any such resolution may be revoked at any time by a resolution of that House.”

AND WHEREAS the Government of Antigua and Barbuda is satisfied that the continued effectiveness of the various protocols and measures to control the spread of the dangerous infectious disease **COVID-19** requires that the State of Public Emergency be continued for a further period of three months or until the 27th day of September, 2021 unless sooner revoked by a Resolution of the Parliament.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT this Parliament in accordance with Section 20 subsection (5) of the Constitution of Antigua and Barbuda **HEREBY EXTENDS** the State of Public Emergency for a further ninety (90) days or until the 27th day of September, 2021

PUBLIC HEALTH (DANGEROUS INFECTIOUS DISEASE) (HOSTING OF EVENTS) REGULATIONS 2021, made by the Board pursuant to Section 102 of the Public Health Act, Cap. 353.

1. Citation

These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Hosting of Events) Regulations, 2021.

2. Interpretation

In these Regulations –

“event” means any fete, party, concert or similar activity occurring in Antigua and Barbuda, the hosting of which is subject to the approval of the Festivals Commission;

3. Requirements for hosting of an event

(1) Every person who desires to host an event during the period 1st July, 2021 to 31st December 2021 shall comply with the following provisions –

(a) all organizers, promoters and employees of organizers and promoters who are performing any task during the event must be fully vaccinated;

(b) the sale of tickets for entry to the event shall be done online only;

(c) a record of the name of the purchaser and the ticket number or numbers purchased by the particular purchaser must be kept for a period of six (6) months after the date on which the event is held;

(d) all public health regulations issued by the Board for the prevention of the spread of **COVID-19** shall apply at all times during the hosting of the event.

(2) No event shall be held with more than 300 persons in attendance.

(3) An organizer or promoter who hosts any event in breach of the requirements of these Regulations commit and offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars.

4. Hosting of events conditional

The Festivals Commission may not approve the hosting of any event or permit an event to be held where, in the discretion of the Board, the hosting of the event poses a significant risk to public health.

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Amendment) (No. 10) Regulations, 2021.

2. Interpretation

In these Regulations –

“principal Regulations” means the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) Regulations 2020, Statutory Instrument No. 16 of 2020

3. Amendment of regulation 5A of the principal Regulations

Regulation 5A of the principal Regulations is amended as follows –

(a) in paragraph 1 (Duration), by repealing the paragraph in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

“1. Duration

These special measures shall take effect from 5:00am on Monday 28th June, 2021 and shall continue until Monday 27th September 2021 unless modified or repealed.”

(b) in paragraph 3 (Mandatory Curfew) by inserting after subparagraph (1) the following new subparagraph-

“(1A) A person who was in attendance at an approved event and is able to establish to the satisfaction of law enforcement that he or she is coming from said approved event shall have a defence against a charge for breach of the mandatory curfew where the proposed breach occurred between 11:00p.m on the night of the event and 3:00am of the next day following.”

(c) by repealing the date “28th June, 2021” wheresoever it occurs and replacing these occurrences with the date “27th September, 2021”.

4. Public Health Protocols continue to apply

All regulations, rules and protocols issued by the Board shall continue to apply with the necessary modification as to the date as herein mentioned.
