**STATUTORY INSTRUMENT**

**PUBLIC HEALTH ACT (DANGEROUS INFECTIOUS DISEASE) (AMENDMENT) (No. 19) REGULATIONS 2021, made by the Board pursuant to Section 102 of the Public Health Act, Cap. 353.**

### 1. Citation and commencement

(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) (Amendment) (No. 19) Regulations, 2021.

### 2. Interpretation

In these Regulations –

“principal Regulations” means the Public Health Act (Dangerous Infectious Disease) Regulations 2020, Statutory Instrument No. 16 of 2020

### 3. Amendment of Regulation 5A of the principal Regulations

Regulation 5A of the principal Regulations is amended as follows –

(a) in paragraph 4 (Opening of businesses and conditions) by inserting after subparagraph (6) the following:


“(7) Every business owner having five (5) or more persons in his or her employ shall mandate that such employees be vaccinated against COVID-19.”

(b) in paragraph 4A (Bars, Clubs and Cinemas) by repealing the words “29<sup>th</sup> October, 2021” and replacing these with the words “12<sup>th</sup> November, 2021”.

(c) in paragraph 8 (Regulations applicable to Educational Institutions) by inserting after subparagraph (3) the following:

“(4) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this paragraph, all schools throughout Antigua and Barbuda shall be opened and be permitted to conduct face to face instructions as of Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2021 in accordance with the directions issued by the Ministry of Education.”

(d) In paragraph 11 (Permitted use of beaches) by repealing subparagraph (4) in its entirety.
