Antigua and Barbuda Bureau of Standards Notice

The Antigua and Barbuda Bureau of Standards wishes to advise the General Public and all stakeholder agencies that effective November 18, 2022, the following standards shall be declared to be Standards, and Antigua and Barbuda Standards, pursuant to section 17 (1) and (3) of the Standards Act (411) of the revised laws of Antigua and Barbuda, 1992 edition and section 3 (1) of the Standards Regulations 1998: -

1) ABNS 2 Part 3 : 2022 Labelling of pharmaceuticals (Revision)

Scope

This standard describes general labelling requirements for drugs. It is applicable to all drugs which are manufactured, imported, exported, sold or distributed within Antigua and Barbuda.

The Revision of this standards was supervised by the Chemicals and Chemicals Based Products Technical Committee and approved by the Antigua and Barbuda Standards Council on September 29, 2022.

2) ABNS 62: 2019 Processed foods – Brown sugar – Specification (CRS 62:2019 IDT)

Scope

This document specifies the requirements for brown sugar intended for direct human consumption.

3) ABNS CRS 34: 2018 Cocoa and chocolate products – Specification (CRS 34: 2018 IDT)

Scope

This standard specifies requirements for the composition of food products derived from fermented and dried cocoa beans. This standard does not apply to:

- a) raw cocoa products, that is, products made from cocoa beans which are either unfermented, or unroasted or both and which can be either wet or dry.
- b) Confectionery and other food products where chocolate or cocoa powder is merely a flavor; or
- c) non-food products, including, pharmaceuticals and cosmetics.

The National Adoption of these standards was supervised by the National Codex, Food and Agriculture Technical Committee and approved by the Antigua and Barbuda Standards Council on September 29, 2022.

4) ISO ABNS 22301: 2019 Security and resilience – Business continuity management systems – Requirements (IDT ISO 23301:2019)

Scope

This document specifies requirements to implement, maintain and improve management system to protect against, reduce the likelihood of the occurrence of, prepare for, respond to and recover from disruptions when they arise.

The requirements specified in this document are generic and intended to be applicable to all organizations, or parts thereof, regardless of type, size and nature of the organization. The extent of application of these requirements depends on the organization's operating environmental and complexity.

This document is applicable to all types and sizes of organization that:

- a) implement , maintain and improve a BCMS;
- b) seek to ensure conformity with stated business continuity policy;
- c) need to be able to continue to deliver products and service at an acceptable predefined capacity during disruption;

d) seek to enhance their resilience through the effective application of the BCMS.

5) ISO ABNS 31000: 2018 Risk management – Guidelines (IDT ISO 31000: 2018)

Scope

This document provides guidelines on managing risk faced by organizations. The application of these guidelines can be customized to any organization and its context.

This document provides a common approach to managing any type of risk and is not industry or sector specific.

This document can be used throughout the life of the organization and can be applied to any activity including decision – making at all levels.

6) ISO ABNS 22316: 2017 Security and resilience – Organizational resilience – Principles and attributes (IDT ISO 22316:2017)

Scope

This document provides guidance to enhance organizational resilience for any size or type of organization. It is not specific to any industry or sector. This document can be applied throughout the life of an organization.

This document does not promote uniformity approaches across all organizations, as specific objectives and initiatives are tailored to suit an individual organization’s needs.

7) ISO ABNS 22320: 2018 Security and resilience – Emergency management – Guidelines for incident management (IDT ISO 22320: 2018)

Scope

This document gives guidelines for incident management, including

- principles that communicate the value and explain the purpose of incident management
- basic components of incident management including process and structure, which focus on roles and responsibilities tasks and management of resources , and
- working together through joint directions and cooperation.

8) ISO ABNS 22395: 2018 Security and Resilience – Community resilience – Guidelines for supporting vulnerable persons in an emergency (IDT ISO 22395: 2018)

Scope

This document gives guidelines for organizations to identify, involve, and communicate with and support individuals who are the most vulnerable to natural and human-induced (both intentional and unintentional) emergencies. It also include guidelines for continually improving the provision of support to vulnerable persons in an emergency.

It is intended for use by organizations with the responsibility for, or involvement in, part or all of the planning for working with vulnerable persons in an emergency.

It is applicable to all types and sizes of organization involved in emergency preparation, responses and recovery activities , such as local , regional and national governments statutory bodies; internationally and non-governmental organization; businesses; and public and community groups.

The National Adoption of these standards was supervised by the Business Security and Risk Project Team and approved by the Antigua and Barbuda Standards Council on September 29, 2022.

9) ABNS CRS 66: 2021 Sustainable tourism – Environmental management systems - Requirements (IDT CRS 66: 2021)

This National Standard establishes requirements for environmental management systems (EMS) to enable tourism establishments to formulate a policy, Objectives and minimum performance requirements based on best environmental management practice.

It is intended for establishment providing tourism related services that wish to implement and maintain an EMS and demonstrate such conformance.

This standard does not apply to organization such as government ministries, regulatory departments and agencies, associations and statutory bodies that do not provide a tourism related tourism.

10) ABNS CRS 67: 2021 Sustainable Tourism – Energy management and efficiency – Requirements (IDT CRS 67: 2021)

This standard specifies requirements for an energy management and efficiency programme to be implemented at tourism establishments. It provides the basis to enable these tourism establishments to review their energy consumption and implement efficiency measure thus minimizing energy use.

This standard does not apply to organizations such as government ministries, regulatory departments and agencies, associations and statutory bodies that do not provide a tourism related service.

11) ABNS CRS 68: 2021 Sustainable Tourism – Food safety and sanitation – Requirements (IDT CRS 68: 2018)

This National Standard provides requirements for implementation and maintenance of a good safety and sanitation programme for tourism establishments.

While these requirements may be applicable to other establishments where food is prepared and served, for the purposes of this documents the standard applies to all food premises which are part of the tourism establishment.

This standard applies to structures, and food transport vehicles and associated equipment, fixtures and fittings used by the food business in the tourism establishment.

This standard does not apply to organization such as government ministries, regulatory departments and agencies, associations and statutory bodies that do not provide a tourism related service.

12) ABNS CRS 69: 2021 Sustainable tourism – Water treatment, management and efficiency – Requirements (IDT CRS 69: 2021)

This National Standard specifies requirements for a water treatment management and efficiency programme for tourism establishment including:

- a) the definition of terms common to water service providers;
- b) basic requirements for drinking water supply and treatment systems;
- c) guidelines for objectives, service assessment criteria and related performance indicators;
- d) benchmarks for measuring performance of water management, treatment and efficiency

This standard does not apply to:

- a) organizations such as government ministries, regulatory departments and agencies, associations and statutory bodies that do not provide a tourism related service; and
- b) objectives set forth by the national water authority and other relevant agencies which are to be achieved through implementation of national standards and compliance obligations

13) ABNS CRS 70: 2021 Sustainable Tourism – Solid waste management - Requirements (IDT CRS 70: 2021)

This National Standards provides requirements for the implementation and maintenance and maintenance of a solid waste management programme for tourism establishment.

This standard does not apply:

- a) Organizations such as government ministries, regulatory departments and agencies , associations and statutory bodies that does not provide a tourism related service; and

b) Solid solutions, solids in solutions and non-solid waste.

14) ABNS CRS 71: 2021 Sustainable Tourism – Sewage treatment and management – Requirements (IDT CRS 71: 2021)

This National Standard specifies requirements for the management of sewage including collection, treatment and disposal, and other effluents generated at tourism establishments.

This standard does not apply to organizations such as government ministries, regulatory departments and agencies, associations and statutory bodies that do not provide a tourism related service.

15) ABNS CRS 72 : 2021 Sustainable tourism – Integrated pest management systems – Requirements (IDT CRS 72: 2021)

This standard specifies requirements for an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) systems developed and implemented within a tourism establishment.

This national standard is applicable to IPM programmes throughout tourism establishments.

This standard does not apply to organizations such as government ministries, regulatory departments and agencies, associations, and statutory bodies that do not provide a tourism related service.

The National Adoption of these standards was supervised by the Tourism and Hospitality Technical Committee and approved by the Antigua and Barbuda Standards Council on September 29, 2022.

NOTICE OF DESIGNATION OF THE REDONDA ECOSYSTEM RESERVE

UNDER THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT ACT, 2019

The Director of the Department of Environment hereby gives notice of her intention to advise the Minister with the responsibility for the Environment to declare the **Redonda Ecosystem Reserve** as an IUCN Category 4 Habitat and Species Management Area pursuant to section 55 (1) of the *Environmental Protection and Management Act, 2019*.

This notice serves as the notice required under s 56(2) (b) of same which requires that the Director provide details as to:

- A description of the category of protected area that is proposed;
- The nature of the activities permitted or prohibited on it;
- Where submissions may be made in writing by any person;
- The closing date for submissions, and;
- The address where submissions may be made.

Description:

Redonda (16°56'N; 62°21'W) is the uninhabited third island in the state of Antigua and Barbuda. It lies 56km southwest of Antigua, 22 km northwest of Montserrat and 32km southeast of Nevis. Redonda is 1.6 km long, 0.5 km wide and rises to nearly 400m.

The **Redonda Ecosystem Reserve** will be designated as a Category 4 Habitat and Species Management Area and will comprise a terrestrial and marine area. The terrestrial area will be managed mainly for conservation of the species found thereon through management intervention by permitted groups namely, the Environmental Awareness Group through partnership with the Department of Environment. Strict biosecurity protocols will be applicable for any activities occurring in the Reserve.

The Redonda Ecosystem Reserve includes a total sea area of 295.866 squared kilometers expanding outward from the **Replenishment Zone** (defined below) and is defined as all ocean waters extending 1 kilometer in all directions beyond the 500ft depth contour surrounding the Redonda Coral Bank with:

- i) its northernmost point (A) at 17 05' 51.432N, 62 21' 31.788W,
- ii) its easternmost point (B) at 16 58' 39.216N, 62 15' 43.524W,
- iii) its southernmost point (C) at 16 51' 07.236N, 62 22' 07.752W and;
- iv) its westernmost point (D) at 17 01' 47.604N, 62 25' 23.088W.

The marine area comprises of the above area as well as a 500 m zone immediately surrounding the island called the **Replenishment Zone**. This zone has many purposes and will be utilized primarily for essential scientific research and monitoring activities as well as providing a disturbance (human, boat etc.) free area for protection the marine life found in these waters. This zone will also provide a biosecurity buffer to prevent invasive species reinvasion, protect the sunken cultural heritage found within the zone and protect persons and vessels from the dangerous cliffs and slopes of the island. The Replenishment Zone occupies a total sea area of 2.56 squared kilometers and is defined as the sea area extending 500m in all directions around the rocky volcanic island of of Redonda with:

- i) its northernmost point (A) at 16 56' 57.336N, 62 20 50.280W,
- ii) its easternmost point (B) at 16 56' 16.392N, 062 20' 12.228W,
- iii) its southernmost point (C) at 16 55' 40.188N, 062 20 47.220W, and;
- iv) its westernmost point (D) at 16 56' 00.926N, 62 21' 10.584W.

Activities permitted in the Redonda Ecosystem Reserve:

Terrestrial

- Essential monitoring and biosecurity by permitted individuals
- Essential restoration and management by permitted individuals

- Limited scientific and nature tourism by permitted individuals
- Monitoring of volcanic activity of the Lesser Antilles by permitted individuals
- Commercial filmmaking and photography by permitted individuals upon payment of fee
- Scientific research by permitted individuals
- Non-damaging activities by permitted individuals

Marine (beyond the boundaries of the Replenishment Zone)

- Fishing in accordance with the Fisheries Act, CAP its amendments and regulations
- Diving
- Scientific research by permitted individuals

Activities prohibited in the Redonda Ecosystem Reserve:

Terrestrial

- Construction of boat landing facilities
- Permanent construction or landscape modifications unless deemed necessary by the Department of Environment
- Collection/removal of plant, animal or mineral materials without permission
- Hunting, trapping or killing of plants or animals without permission
- Importation of soil or other organic matter
- Importation of plant or animal material without permission
- Removal of historic and archaeological artefacts
- Disposal of packaging, solid and liquid organic waste
- Disposal of liquid and human waste

Marine (within the boundaries of the Replenishment Zone)

- Accessing the island of Redonda
- Extractive activities (mining, dredging, all fishing, collecting of resources)

Marine (beyond the boundaries of the Replenishment Zone)

- Harvesting of all species of Parrotfish found therein
- Removal of historic and archaeological artefacts
- Disposal of packaging, solid and liquid organic waste
- Disposal of liquid and human waste
- Extractive activities including but not limited to all forms of mining or dredging
