EXPLANATORY NOTE ON REVISED MEDIATION FEES (RE-ISSUE)

Introduction

The Schedule of revised mediation fees was approved for implementation by Her Ladyship, The Hon. Dame Janice M. Pereira, DBE, Chief Justice in accordance with paragraph 10 of Practice Direction No. 6 of 2020 – Court-Connected Mediation (Re-Issue), issued by Her Ladyship, The Hon. Dame Janice M. Pereira, DBE, Chief Justice, on 9th October, 2020.

However, a review of the implementation of the Schedule of revised fees across the Member States and Territories under the jurisdiction of the Eastern Caribbean Supreme Court (ECSC) has warranted a Re-issue of the revised fee schedule. The Re-Issue is intended to provide guidance on the proper application and interpretation of the revised fees, in an effort to ensure consistency across the Member States and Territories and to safeguard the harmonisation thrust.

Interpretation

In relation to the Revised Mediation Fee Schedule (Re-issue), unless otherwise provided for or the context otherwise requires -

“Per Side” – includes all of the disputants who are either claimants or defendants on a particular side;

“Per Side/Per Counsel” - means that the operation of the mediation fee on a “per side” basis is subject to an exception whereby the parties/disputants on the same side and who are represented by the same legal practitioner, shall share the mediation fee equally for the initial session or for further mediation sessions as if they were one party to the matter. However, the parties/disputants who are on the same side but represented by different legal practitioners shall be required to pay the full fee for the initial mediation session or for further mediation sessions (*See examples below*);

“Per Party” – means one (1) party or one (1) disputant on either side whether a claimant or defendant; and

“Pro se Litigant” – means a party/disputant who appears in a matter in his/her own behalf without the assistance of a legal practitioner.

Application

The mediation fee to be paid by the parties/disputants for the first (1st) mediation session or for further mediation sessions shall be on a “per side” basis. What this means is that the fee for the 1st mediation session or for further mediation sessions, shall be shared equally by all of the parties/disputants on a side whether they are collectively the claimants or defendants to a case.

Exception: Per Side/Per Counsel

The operation of the mediation fee on a “per side” basis does not apply in circumstances where the parties/disputants on a side, are represented by different legal practitioners. In those circumstances, the parties/disputants who are on the same side and represented by the same legal

practitioner shall share the mediation fee equally for the initial session or for further mediation sessions on a “per side” basis as explained above. However, the parties/disputants who are on the same side but represented by different legal practitioners shall be required to pay the full fee for the initial mediation session or for further mediation sessions.

Application in Practice:

The following examples serve to clarify the appropriate application of the “per side” basis, for the fees for the 1st mediation session:

The following are the claimants and defendants to a claim before the High Court, which has been referred to mediation by means of a Mediation Referral Order in Form M1.

John Doe/Jane Doe/Gina Harford - Claimants

Peter John/Paul Rushford/Inglefield Longe - Defendants

For the purposes of the example let us assume that the fee “per side” for the 1st mediation session is \$500.00. John and Jane Doe employed the services of the same legal practitioner to represent their interests in the case, while Gina Harford employed the services of another legal practitioner. In the case of the claimants, John and Jane Doe shall share the fee for the 1st mediation session equally. While Gina Harford shall be required to pay the full mediation fee for the 1st mediation session.

So that the mediation fees to be paid by the claimants for the 1st mediation session amount to:

John Doe - \$250.00;

Jane Doe - \$250.00; and

Gina Harford - \$500.00.

Let us consider the fee applicable in relation to the defendants. For the purposes of the example, let us assume that Peter John, Paul Rushford and Inglefield Longe have employed the services of the same legal practitioner. Therefore, in the case of the defendants, all three disputants shall share the mediation fee for the 1st session equally.

So that the mediation fee to be paid by the defendants amount to:

Peter John - \$166.67;

Paul Rushford - \$166.67; and

Inglefield Longe - \$166.67.

It should be noted that in circumstances where all disputants on a side have employed the services of separate legal practitioners, each disputant would be required to pay the full fee of \$500.00 for the 1st mediation session. For the purposes of our example, let us assume that all of the claimants employed the services of separate legal practitioners. Therefore, each disputant on the claimant side shall be required to pay the mediation fee separately.

So that the mediation fee to be paid by the claimants in the second scenario amount to:

John Doe - \$500.00;

Jane Doe - \$500.00; and

Gina Harford - \$500.00.

Further Mediation

With respect to further mediation sessions, parties/disputants are required to pay the mediation fee at an hourly rate. However, the application of the hourly rate shall also be on a “per side” basis, identical to the application of the “per side” basis, employed for the mediation fee for the 1st mediation session and likewise subject to the Per Side/Per Counsel exception.

Application in Practice:

The following example serves to clarify the appropriate application of the “per side” basis for the fees for further mediation sessions:

The following are the claimants and defendants to a claim before the High Court, which has been referred to mediation by means of a Mediation Referral Order in Form M1.

John Doe/Jane Doe/Gina Harford - Claimants

Peter John/Paul Rushford/Inglefield Longe - Defendants

For the purposes of the example let us assume that the hourly fee for further mediation “per side” is \$125.00. John and Jane Doe employed the services of the same legal practitioner to represent their interests in the case, while Gina Harford employed the services of another legal practitioner. In the case of the claimants, John and Jane Doe shall share the hourly fee for the applicable number of hours of further mediation equally. While Gina Harford shall be required to pay the full hourly mediation fee for the applicable number of hours of further mediation.

Assuming that the parties/disputants agreed to three (3) hours of further mediation, the mediation fees to be paid by the claimants for further mediation amount to:

John Doe - \$187.50;

Jane Doe - \$187.50; and

Gina Harford - \$375.00.

Let us consider the fee applicable in relation to the defendants. For the purposes of the example, let us assume that Peter John, Paul Rushford and Inglefield Longe have employed the services of the same legal practitioner. Therefore, in the case of the defendants, all three disputants shall share the mediation fee for the applicable number of hours of further mediation equally.

So that the mediation fee to be paid by the defendants for three (3) hours of further mediation amount to:

Peter John - \$125.00;

Paul Rushford - \$125.00; and

Inglefield Longe - \$125.00.

It should be noted that in circumstances where all disputants on a side have employed the services of separate legal practitioners, each disputant would be required to pay the full fee of \$125.00 per hour for the applicable number of hours of further mediation. For the purposes of our example, let us assume that all of the claimants employed the services of separate legal practitioners. Therefore, each disputant on the claimant side shall be required to pay the full hourly fee separately.

So that the mediation fee to be paid by the claimants in the second scenario for three (3) hours of further mediation amount to:

John Doe - \$375.00;

Jane Doe - \$375.00; and

The examples above are for illustration purposes only and should be used as a guide by legal practitioners and other users of the court, when calculating mediation fees under the Revised Mediation Fee Schedule (Re-issue).

“Pro se” Litigants

A “Pro se” litigant shall, in circumstances where he/she appears in a matter where there is more than one (1) party/disputant on the same side as the “Pro se” litigant, share the mediation fee equally with the other parties/disputants on his/her side, provided that the “Pro se” litigant shares a common interest or position in respect of the matter with the other parties/disputants on his/her side. “Pro se” litigants who do not meet the criteria set out above, shall be required to pay the full mediation fee whether they are the claimants or defendants to a case and whether the mediation fee is for the first mediation session or for further mediation sessions.

The Revised Mediation Fee Schedule (Re-issue) takes effect on 1st September, 2023.

These fees take effect on 1st September, 2023 and apply to the following Member States and Territories: Anguilla, Antigua and Barbuda, the Commonwealth of Dominica, Grenada, Montserrat, Saint Christopher and Nevis, Saint Lucia and the Territory of the Virgin Islands.

However, the parties/disputants who are on the same side but represented by different legal practitioners shall be required to pay the full fee for the initial mediation session or for further mediation sessions.
